The California Voting Rights Act was written to specifically encourage bydistrict elections.



Districting Process

Step	Description
First Hearing March 13, 2023	Held prior to release of draft maps.
Second Hearing April 10, 2023	Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
Release draft maps	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to 3 rd hearing.
First Hearing on draft maps July 10, 2023	Meeting to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
2nd Hearing on draft maps August 14, 2023	Meeting to adopt the final map.
Map adoption	Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.

1st Question: What is your neighborhood or community of interest?

- ☐ Shared issue or characteristic
 - □ Shared social or economic interest
 - Impacted by governing board's policies
- □ Tell us "your community's story"

2nd Question: What are its geographic boundaries?

Examples of physical features defining a neighborhood boundary:

- Natural neighborhood dividing lines, such as highway or major roads, rivers, canals and/or hills
- ☐ Areas around parks or schools
- □ Other neighborhood landmarks

In the absence of public testimony, planning records and other similar documents may provide definition.
